SPOTLIGHT NEWS

An Interview with Ms. Dee Steeley, Former Niskayuna Music Teacher



Where did you grow up?

I grew up downstate in Middletown, NY. I was always in chorus and loved to sing. Even my kindergarten teacher wrote that I had a sweet singing voice and loved music. In 4th grade I studied the sax, but that wasn't a good fit for me. I sang in select ensembles in high school, participated in All County festivals and had the privilege of being selected to sing with the Hudson Valley Philharmonic. I started my college journey in Potsdam, and ended up with a Music degree in Music Theory, Music Literature and Music History from West Chester University, in Pennsylvania. I moved to Albany to pursue a Master's Degree in Music Education. My teaching career began at Coxsackie-Athens School District, where I taught choirs and general music for 7 years, and then made the wonderful move to Niskayuna in 1993, where I taught at Iroquois for 26 years.

When did you know that you wanted to go to music school?

I really knew I wanted to be involved in music when I sat in the concert for band (with my sax), and heard all the music around me. I was so inspired! But more than that, I always loved to sing and loved my high school choral director.

Tell us about the early days and some memorable moments of the Niskayuna music program.

When I came to Niskayuna in 1993, I was so surprised by the talents and musical abilities of the students. Soon after arriving, both VA and Iroquois purchased a Yamaha keyboard lab program for the general music classroom, an all hands-on learning for middle level students. For the time, it was state of the art and I loved teaching it and especially loved seeing the excitement of the students. We were a very unified department, all using the Gordon Music Learning Theory, which included ear training in our classrooms. Some of the best memories were participating with the choirs in Choral Majors NYSSMA (26 performances and evaluations in all), and also taking the 7/8 grade choirs to NYC each year to experience a musical venue and also a Broadway show. A highlight was seeing Bernadette Peters in Hello Dolly! A unique experience was forming a barbershop quarter with four talented choir guys, singing a cappella, 4-part harmony! No surprise one of them is currently on Broadway. Being at Niskayuna supported my desire to obtain National Board Certification, which I have had for the past 20 years, and was the 4th teacher in NY State to get certified at my level. The whole process allowed me to reflect on my teaching practices, the students and their growth. I absolutely loved forming our select middle school vocal ensemble, Mezzo Voce.

What are your experiences in the music world outside of Niskayuna?

For the past 15 years I have been a NYSSMA solo piano and vocal adjudicator. This past year I became All-State certified for voice. Throughout my entire career I have had private vocal and piano students, many of whom have participated in NYSSMA. Over the years I have also been a guest conductor.

Do you have any favorite extracurricular activities that you want to share?

Since retiring, I have gotten very involved with exercise! I currently work with a personal trainer, doing weight lifting, and also became a certified Zumba instructor! Each August I attend an international convention in Orlando to share a week with Zumba instructors from all over the world. It is truly my new passion! Since I miss the classroom very much, I am also subbing at Nisky! I love to be back, interacting with the students and my friends.

Do you have any advice to students studying music now?

For those students in the music program, try to get every minute of joy out of practicing, lessons and rehearsals. These situations are so unique and provide such fulfillment, friendships and pride.

Do you have any advice to students who want to pursue music as their career?

For those students who want to major in music, follow your passion. Work hard, practice, learn everything you can, ask questions. And if you go into education, always remember that you never know who you are really impacting each day in the classroom. Always focus on the students and appreciate their little successes as well as big. I have truly loved teaching music for my life's work. Passion is a powerful motivator.

Nisky Alum Returns to Teach Double Reed Workshop

Hannah Staudinger, class of 2014, will visit Niskayuna on March 24th and March 25th to conduct a masterclass and play in a recital with our oboe and bassoon students in grades 7-12. This is a special program planned to celebrate "Music in Our Schools Month".

Hannah is a freelance oboist and educator based in Boston, Massachusetts, who performs regularly across the New England area with groups such as the New Bedford Symphony Orchestra, Vista Philharmonic, and Streetlight Manifesto. She currently serves as the principal oboist of the Kendall Square Orchestra and Boston Civic Symphony.



Hannah is an experienced educator who is interested in the cross section of education and repertoire. She has given a number of lectures and recitals based on her research found in her paper, *Repertoire within Education: An analysis of Oboe Repertoire for High School Adjudications*. Hannah holds a Master's in Oboe Performance from Boston University, and Bachelor's degrees in Oboe Performance and Music Education from the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University. Currently, Hannah is a Doctoral Candidate at Boston University studying with Mark McEwen of the Boston Symphony.

We are very excited to have Hannah work with our double reed students in a Masterclass on Sunday, March 24th. On Monday, March 25th, Ms. Staudinger, alongside our Nisky oboists and bassoonists as well as other guests, will perform an informal recital at 7pm in the NHS Auditorium. If you have ever wondered about the complexities of playing a double reed instrument, or if you just want to hear beautiful music, please come and check it out!





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
