


# FOM IS CELEBRATING ITS 50th BIRTHDAY! (But we could pass for 55!)

At a recent Friends of Music (FOM) Executive Committee meeting, **Mr. Hughes** mentioned coming across some documentation amongst his office papers of FOM's first meeting in 1966. A discussion followed on how we could mark this auspicious occasion. At some point during the discussion, however, we noticed that our logo very clearly states "since 1961." Confused about our actual age, we decided we had better delve more deeply into figuring out FOM's true birthday.

I immediately turned to **Diane Smith**, one of our former presidents and a long time member and supporter. Diane has in depth knowledge about our organization; she relayed the following information to me:

Friends of Music initially began in 1961, albeit informally, through the leadership of **Wendell Phillips**. **Mr. Phillips** was the first Director of Music Education in Niskayuna (one of our Senior Awards is named in his honor), and had observed similar parent groups in Massachusetts.

**Mr. Phillips** helped to introduce Friends of Music to Niskayuna in the fall of 1961. Initially, parents "were active informally" in publishing a newsletter, Music Notes, for grades Kindergarten through 12 and for hosting school concerts.

However, in May 1966, **Anthony Greenly** was elected the first President of the Friends of Music at its first annual meeting. The bylaws were written and Niskayuna Friends of Music became an official organization sanctioned by the district. The organization then took on several more enrichment activities and fundraising. **(Diane Smith)**

## **New Faculty**

Kate Jarrard (String faculty) is a Crane School of Music graduate and taught for ten years in the Plattsburgh City School District. She served as the NYSSMA Zone 6 Representative and was the Clinton County Music Educators' Association Vice President, chairing numerous student honors ensembles. She directed string orchestras and wind ensembles for the Adirondack Youth Orchestra Association and was involved with local drama clubs. Ms. Jarrard performs on both string and woodwind instruments and is a member of the American String Teachers Association. She conducts the Sixth Grade Orchestra here at Niskayuna and teaches the string programs at Glencliff and Hill-side as well as lessons at Iroquois.

**Karen Scherer** (Band faculty) earned her BS and MS degrees from The College of St. Rose in saxophone, studying piano as a secondary instrument. She comes to Niskayuna after a successful career teaching band, chorus and general music for the Voorheesville, Cohoes and Amsterdam school districts. In addition to woodwind lessons at Iroquois, **Mrs. Scherer** is in charge of the band programs at **Craig** and **Glencliff**.

Brenda Schmidt (String Faculty) Ms. Schmidt taught for the Vestal Central School District for nine years prior to joining us. With degrees from the Crane School of Music and SUNY Stony Brook she has performed with the Schenectady Symphony Orchestra, Broome County Chamber Strings, Basically Bach Ensemble, and Orchestra of Northern New York, among others. Her ensembles have received Gold with Distinction ratings from NYSSMA Major Organization adjudication festivals. Ms. Schmidt conducts our Eighth Grade Orchestra and teaches the string programs at Birchwood and Rosendale in addition to teaching lessons at Iroquois.

### SCHENECTADY SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA COLLABORATION

It is with great pride and pleasure that we announce that **Ladies First** and **Concert Chorale** will be joining The Schenectady Symphony Orchestra on Sunday, January 22 at 3:00 p.m. at the historic Proctors Theatre. We are so honored that the SSO sought out Niskayuna's choral program nearly two years ago to schedule this exciting opportunity! For many of our students it may be the one and only time they will sing a masterwork and experience such a large scale collaboration with an orchestra in such a special venue. In addition, select fifth grade students will be joining to perform British composer John Rutter's Mass of the Children written for SATB and treble choruses with orchestra. ### **Change in Curriculum/Program**

Choral students will see a change in the Niskayuna High School Program of Studies for 2017-2018. Any choral students who are interested in auditioning for an upper level select honors ensemble (Concert Chorale, Bel Canto Voices, and/or Studio Singers) will be required to participate in one year of High School Choir or Ladies First as a prerequisite. A similar model is used in other departments, requiring a foundational course before enrolling in advanced honors courses (i.e. the Art Department requires all students to take Studio in Art before pursuing other advanced electives). Such a change will create a common vocabulary and foundation amongst all students and continue to build the best program possible. 


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
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
