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# SPOTLIGHT NOTES

#### Spotlight on Brenda Hartman

The Niskayuna Friends of Music would like to give a very warm welcome to **Mrs. Brenda Hartman** (*see photo*) to the Niskayuna Music Department. Mrs. Hartman joined the Music Department Faculty in 2016.

Mrs. Hartman is a native of the Capital District and a graduate of the Bethlehem Schools. Mrs. Hartman attended the Crane School of Music/State University of Potsdam where she studied Performance and Music Education and was principal violist of the Crane Symphony Orchestra. Mrs. Hartman also earned a Master's Degree in Liberal Studies (concentration in Music and Education) from the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

Mrs. Hartman returns to the Capital District after having taught music for nine years in the **Vestal Central School District**, near Binghamton. There she taught middle school string instruments and elementary music. Here at Niskayuna, Mrs. Hartman leads the orchestras at both the **Rosendale** and **Birchwood Elementary Schools** as well as the **8**<sup>th</sup> grade orchestra. Mrs. Hartman also conducts the **Middle School Chamber Strings** with **Mrs. McClenon**. In addition, Mrs. Hartman is responsible for teaching the instrument lessons at **Iroquois Middle School**.

Outside of the school day, Mrs. Hartman participates in the Schenectady Symphony Orchestra. During my chat with Mrs. Hartman, she commented that for her the orchestra experience has come full circle. As a Bethlehem student, Mrs. Hartman not



only played in the **Empire State Youth Orchestra**, she was one of a select few students invited to perform with the Schenectady Symphony Orchestra. When she returned to the Capital Region, Mrs. Hartman's first concert with the **Schenectady Symphony Orchestra** included the experience of Niskayuna students who sang that performance with the Orchestra!

Mrs. Hartman had a great deal of performing experience while in college, having participated in the Crane Symphony orchestra, the ballet/opera orchestra, string quartets, a piano quintet, and concert choir all while at Crane School of Music.

In her work since college, Mrs. Hartman sought to expand her experiences to take on a new role as a judge in festival and performance competitions. Most recently Mrs. Hartman is hoping to increase her involvement with NYSSMA adjudication. In her free time, Mrs. Hartman enjoys a movie, reading, mini-golf and, bowling. Two of her favorite places are Maine and Disney World and music is such a part of her life that her cats are named Melody and Harmony!

Mrs. Hartman is very excited to be working here in the Niskayuna School District. The support she receives from fellow faculty members is "the best" according to Mrs. Hartman and she is very excited that music is such an integral part of the school district curriculum. Mrs. Hartman feels that music is so important to the human experience. In her opinion, music is a universal language affecting all aspects a person's life and creating connections everywhere. Mrs. Hartman's strongest piece of advice to her students is to "love music and PRACTICE! Make it a routine to build your skill and your love of music. You will never regret it!"

# **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL NOTES**

#### Birchwood

Greetings family and friends! We're pleased to let you know that **Mrs. Johnston** is now the full-time K-5 Birchwood general music teacher. She will be with all **Birchwood** students every day and will travel each afternoon to **Iroquois Middle School** for some 6<sup>th</sup> grade general music classes. The staff, families, and students have been so welcoming. It's a pleasure to start each morning greeting the children as they come

in and seeing some former Birchwood students over at the middle school.

Here are some of the fun activities our students are participating in this fall in our "Snoopy" music room. Kindergarten music meets once a week. The children love to learn songs and hear musical stories, play small instruments, and move safely around the room to Mrs. Johnston's iTunes playlist. They are quite impressive at taking turns! Ask your Kindergartener to tell you his/her four voices: speaking, singing, whispering, and one voice for outside, CALLING!

**Grade 1** loves to show Mrs. Johnston that they can't be tricked! They are mastering beginning rhythm reading, dancing to Pete Seeger, and shaking maracas to number/counting songs in English and Spanish. **Grade 2** is in a big Percussion Family Unit. They are learning the names of every percussion instrument in the classroom and how to play them properly. The more they can identify, the quicker they clean up. It's a big help! Also, in this exploration stage, students get to try many world percussion instruments and narrow their choices down to their top three favorites. After this and some



rhythm writing practice, they will create a final project consisting of *Third Grade Tubano Player at Birchwood* a picture of their favorite instrument, a rhythm pattern for it, and a solo performance for the class of their pattern on the instrument. Watch for this assignment to come home late in October! Our third graders are like a huge moving crew! They name and can set up thousands of dollars worth of xylophones safely around the room. With mallets, they play folk song patterns and their treble clef space and line notes. Students also enjoy drawing notes of the treble clef staff using the stylus on the electronic board, software on the teacher's laptop and the old-fashioned way on regular staff paper. **Grade 4** is also working on naming the staff, writing patterns for the xylophone family, reading rhythm patterns and playing note games.

They will resume work on their recorders soon in the Green Ribbon Unit. It should also be said that they have already become very cooperative and skilled chorus singers! In **Grade 5**, we are reviewing instruments of the orchestra through many means. We have listened to, conducted, and watched a BBC performance of Aaron Copland's Ballet "Rodeo: Hoedown". Students have used and explored the Dallas Symphony Orchestra (mydso.com) website. Their interest in these instruments definitely has some roots in the fact that quite a few of them are string, percussion, and wind players themselves now. A fifth grade class session goes by so quickly when the students are so focused. In our 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Chorus we are preparing for our first performance at the Veteran's Recognition Assembly. Our huge undertaking for the January concert includes an African song with complex instruments plus three other selections!

### **Choral Corner**

Greetings to all of the choral students along with your families! We are excited about delving into great choral repertoire as we excitedly anticipate many wonderful events including the 2019 Choral Festival featuring guest conductor **Paula Brinkman**! Mrs. Brinkman is no stranger to Niskayuna as she was a member of the music faculty for over 33 years, the founder of **Concert Chorale, Bel Canto Voices** and **Ladies First**, a community member/parent of three Niskayuna graduates (in addition, she was one of **Mrs. Pizzino-Catalano's** sponsor teachers during her student teaching placement in 2005). Now a resident of North Carolina, she is the founder/director of the Wilmington Choral Society which has grown from 43 to over 100 singers in ten years! We cannot wait to welcome back Mrs. Brinkman and learn from her vast knowledge and experience.

**Studio Singers and Bel Canto Voices** have already jumped into "performance mode" giving families a sneak peak of what has been going on in the classroom on September 27 at Back-to-School Night after only seven rehearsals. Members of these honors choral ensembles began preparing music on their own after receiving an assignment via mailing in mid-August!

Last year, after the written portion of their final examination, students took an online survey about their high school choral experience. General requests included a curiosity for listening examples and repertoire from the continent of Asia, more sight-reading examples to be done in class (yes, shocking!), opportunities to sing/perform more community service and that many students felt more confident after singing in a HS choral ensemble! Several students in **Concert Chorale** mentioned how much they enjoyed singing at the middle schools in addition to the "Warm-Up Assignment" where each person presents an original physical, vocal or solfege warm-up to their peers during the third quarter. **Ladies First** members mentioned how much they enjoyed singing at the Community Center in December and Choir members expressed an interest in more solo opportunities and repertoire in different languages. This important feedback shared by your children will certainly be taken into consideration as the curriculum of each ensemble continues to grow and develop. Many students across the vocal program mentioned how much they enjoy performance opportunities outside of the auditorium and in the community.
