SPOTLIGHT NEWS

Friends of Music interviews Rebecca Farrell, General Music & Chorus teacher at Birchwood ES



Where did you grow up?

I grew up in Latham and attended North Colonie schools (Shaker). **How were you involved in music growing up?**

I started playing the clarinet in 4th grade and sang in chorus in 5th and 6th grade, but I started to become extremely involved in music during junior high. I loved going to my older brother's concerts when he was in junior high. When I got to junior high, I auditioned for some of the afterschool music groups just for fun and suddenly I was staying after school for rehearsals almost every day! I decided in 7th grade that I wanted to become a music teacher, and that inspired me to start taking voice lessons, become involved in Suburban Council, Area All-State, All-State, Melodies of Christmas, etc.

Where did you go to college?

The Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam. I graduated with a Bachelors in Music Education with a concentration in Voice, General Music, and Chorus. I also received a Performance Certificate in Voice.

What are your current responsibilities with Niskayuna?

I teach General Music and 4th & 5th Grade Chorus at Birchwood Elementary. I've also really enjoyed working with my colleagues at the high school, as well as the students, as the Stage Manager of "The Little Mermaid."

What are your goals?

I'm very excited to begin my studies for my Master's Degree in Music Education so that I can continue to expand upon my knowledge and skills as a music teacher! I'd love to start some clubs at Birchwood, become more involved in the Nisky community, and see where this journey as a Nisky music teacher leads me!

What are your favorite things to do outside of school?

I *love* to travel. I've gone to Jamaica twice for study abroad trips, and they were both life changing experiences. One of my major life goals is to make it to all 50 states, explore Europe, and go to Australia! I love spending time with my friends & family and traveling so that I can be with them. Sitting down with a good book, learning how to play a new instrument, and researching all about classic rock are some of my favorite hobbies. Going to concerts is another one of my favorite things to do!

Do you have any advice to students studying music now?

Never give up. It can be hard when something that has always been your passion suddenly becomes "work," but it is *so* worth it in the end. The experiences that you are having, the music that you are creating with some of your best friends, and the memories that you are making are some things that you will never get back or be able to recreate. Breathe in the moment - it is the only moment. All of these moments will be worth it the second you step onto the stage or in the classroom. Trust me.

Do you have any advice to students who want to pursue music as their career?

Become involved in as many musical activities as you can. Every musical experience that you gain will improve your musicianship, expand your horizons, and provide you with experience, but I can also guarantee you that you will meet some of the best friends that you will ever have. Trust your gut. People may try and tell you that a career in the arts isn't stable, but trust your passion. The joy that you can bring to fellow musicians, audience members, students, family members, etc. through your gift is unlike any other. It is unique. It will connect you to people in ways that you would never imagine. This dream that you have of pursuing music is beyond rewarding and fulfilling. You have *so* many people to help you and support you along your journey. Go and achieve your dreams - you got this!

Rosendale Elementary

Preschool Story Hour

The newest in the Rosendale music room is the arrival of the Preschool Story Hour children! An average of eight children have come each week from Ms. Thompson in the media center to Mrs. Johnston's music room. Preschool story hour gives these young friends thirty minutes of music time once a week from January 7 through March 24. They are having voice exploration, singing, singing with actions, movement with and without their movement ribbons, puppets for songs, musical instruments, imaginative play, and music games.

Kindergarten-Grade 2

Our **kindergarten** can do so much more this year! They have that second class a week now and they are on a roll. Our friends enjoy their new multicultural signs for their Do Re Mi musical scale demonstrating hands in different skin colors. They have made up the hand movements for a song in an upcoming K-5 assembly, a job I thought the 5th grade would do! Their teachers and I are so pleased to see them engaged and joyful at these school-wide events, really knowing all the words to the songs like their older schoolmates.

The **first graders** love their formal dance groups for a German polka. Yes, a polka. They are so pleased with themselves. They are showing amazing body awareness and rhythmic competency. Wow! They can also write four beat rhythm patterns of their own and clap and say them. Soon each child will see one favorite pattern she/he wrote for Valentine's Day up on the board for the class to try to clap and say. It's a proud moment and each child secretly hopes that his/hers is the trickiest one!

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL NOTES

Rosendale Elementary (cont.)

In **second grade** they are putting together understanding of the three ways percussion instruments are played, how to form simple measures, how to tell if the instrument is pitched or non-pitched, and how to compose for it. Following a writing process similar to a classroom writing workshop, each student has narrowed down eleven choices to a favorite percussion instrument in the music room, drawn a picture of it, had pre-writing experience, is making a rough draft, will get mini-lessons and an opportunity to conference and edit with Mrs. Johnston. Finally, they will perform their one or two measure percussion piece and have a video uploaded to a music google classroom to watch each other.

Grade 3-5

Third grade has applied ³/₄ time and treble clef staff reading to learn to play the **Westminster Chime pattern** heard in London by Big Ben. Again, choice was offered among pitched percussion in the music room. These students also have a music google classroom and have finished uploading their video performances. Two other units are in their 3rd Grade Music Classroom: a hip-hop educational song about the Weather (a big unit of study in third grade) and their Singalong unit with links to songs for the assembly and the actual slide shows they'll see.

Fourth grade has mastered a piece called the **BAGE Blues**, demonstrating rhythm and note reading on several pitched instruments before switching the melody to their recorders. They played as a percussion/piano ensemble along to an iTunes accompaniment at quite a fast tempo. After this song, they were awarded their Green Ribbons (ala Tae Kwan Do). Members of the **Niskayuna Senior Center on Aqueduct Road** prepared red flannel fabric pieces for the students to use as new cleaning cloths for their recorders.

Fifth grade had a unique experience in January by being included in a NYU student's film project, **Benson's Playground**. Jad Jacob, a 2017 Niskayuna graduate, reached out to his choral teacher and musical director from **Phantom** Mrs. Catalano, and asked where he could find some elementary students to sing a song he wrote for his film. He also needed to record them doing a laugh track. Fortunately for us, she referred him to Rosendale. Our families signed legal media release forms, and now many of our fifth graders are listed in Jad's film credits. The students were true professionals, doing twenty minutes of takes for the song he needed recorded. The laugh track was fun as the kids provided him with all the effects of a studio audience at a sit-com.

Rosendale Chorus

Our winter concert went extremely well, and we received several comments that helped us feel our grade 4/5 chorus is on the right track for going to NYSSMA Festival in April. We started our last NYSSMA piece in Spanish as a Spanish Day with special guest instructor and parent, Mrs. Polishchuk from Hebrew Academy. We included some more fun to launch the challenging song, **Rapsodia Espanola No. 1**, by playing a Motion Leader game to Carlos Santana, having a Latin music playlist, inviting Spanish speaking Rosendale families, some board members, and serving coconut candy and Spanish Cinnamon cookies provided by our chorus families. For the last seven years, he has been recognized as one of the leading trombonists of his generation in *Down Beat* magazine's International Critics' Poll and Readers' Poll. Ferber was the recipient 2013 New Jazz of a *Works* grant from **Chamber Music America**, funded by the Doris Duke Foundation. Since 2011, he has been an Adjunct Professor of Jazz Studies at New York University's Steinhardt School.

A Recommendation for Young Music Lovers

This is a wonderful book for children introducing them to classical compositions inspired by birdsongs. The book also comes with an audio CD with a collection of twenty lovely excerpts by famous composers of the likes of Mozart, Tchaikovsky and Vivaldi.




