#### Spotlight on Kayla Freeden

Friends of Music interviews **Kayla Freeden**, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Band teacher at **Elementary and Middle Schools**.

#### Where did you grow up?

I grew up in Queensbury, NY. Students and the community may know Queensbury from skiing at West Mountain, riding roller coasters at The Great Escape, or eating ice cream at Martha's! I loved growing up in the foothills of the Adirondacks because I was always a short drive from the lake and the surrounding mountains.

#### How were you involved in music growing up?

Growing up, I was always listening to music in my free time. I loved to sing and put on "concerts" for my family with my sister! I started singing in our school's chorus when I was in fourth grade, then when I was given the opportunity to learn an instrument going into fifth grade, I was assigned the flute! After a couple years of taking flute lessons and performing with our school ensemble, I realized that band was the thing I looked forward to the most at school and started to envision what it would be like to be a band teacher. Not only did I love playing the flute and wanted to learn more instruments, but I loved the social aspect of band, especially the friendships that grew within my lesson group and section just within those first couple of years. By the end of seventh grade, I got a saxophone and started taking lessons over the summer. The following year I auditioned for our school's jazz band, so I could play saxophone in that ensemble and continue to play flute in our concert band. Throughout high school, I continued to play both flute and saxophone in various ensembles, participated in the NYSSMA solo festival and enjoyed playing in the pit for our school musicals. I also continued to sing in chorus and was chosen to be part of our select "Madrigal" group in my senior year.

#### Where did you go to college?

I attended Nazareth College in Rochester, NY where I earned my Bachelor of Music in Music Education. My primary instrument was the saxophone and one of my favorite experiences during my time in college was rehearsing and performing in saxophone quartets with other students in my studio!

#### Do you have any favorite extracurricular activities that you want to share?

I enjoy spending time outdoors, especially hiking and kayaking. I'd attribute both of those interests to growing up so close to the Adirondacks and spending most summers camping with my grandparents!

#### What are your current responsibilities with Niskayuna?

I am currently filling in for Mrs. Karen Scherer while she is on maternity leave and I am responsible for the fifth grade bands at Hillside and Craig Elementary Schools, in addition to directing the sixth grade band and teaching sixth grade flute, clarinet and saxophone lessons.

#### What are your goals?

One of my current goals is to complete a graduate program to further my education and to upgrade my teaching certification. I've been very grateful over the last several years to be able to get my grounding in a music classroom and I'm excited to take those experiences with me to earn my next degree!

#### What are your favorite things to do outside of school?

One of my favorite things to do outside of school is play one of my favorite video games - *Animal Crossing*! Decorating my island, fishing, and gardening in the game helps me to relax after a long day. I also love spending time with my cats, Deku and Astro. They are both Bengals, which means they are very active cats! They were leash trained as kittens, so we'll take them on walks where they love to climb trees and explore different trails!

#### Do you have any advice to students studying music now?

My advice to students studying music now would be to find out what makes them excited about music! There are going to be things you're required to study in school or private lessons, but I think it's important to explore and remember that music is a form of individual expression. Whether that's finding (or composing) an arrangement of your favorite video game theme and learning to play it on your instrument or seeking out local concerts to attend, make the most out of your music education by including your individual interests and know that your teachers are here to help and guide you!

#### Do you have any advice to students who want to pursue music as their career?

My advice would be to be proud of the progress you make as a musician. It's so easy to get caught up in comparing yourself to others because being a musician involves that element of competition, whether it's seating auditions, college admission, or job opportunities. Some of that is healthy, because it can be a motivator to improve your own musicianship, but don't let it consume your perspective on your own progress and how far you've come with the work you've put in!

#### 6th Grade Band Meets Heather Hoefle



#### Seventh Grade Band Performs New York Premiere

The Seventh Grade Band is looking forward to the Spring concert on Thursday, May 5th at the High School. The theme of the music selected for the band is "Bodies of Water". The program will start off with March Saranac by John O'Reilly which is an exciting march named after Saranac Lake in the Adirondack Mountains. The second piece brings the listener on an adventure on the ocean named "Scenes from an Ocean Voyage". The first movement entitled "Into the Great Blue Sea", paints a picture of a crew casting off and venturing out to the open sea. This movement features the clanging of an antique ship's bell followed by a beautiful melody played by the clarinets and horns which simulates the ship cresting the gentle waves. The second movement, entitled "Prowling Shark", begins with an ominous melody introduced by the low brass and reeds and the final movement simulates the playful frolicking of a pod of dolphins. The final piece on our portion of the concert is "Cook Strait Crossing" by Laura Estes. Throughout history, Cook Strait has been named one of the most treacherous bodies of water in the world separating the North and South Islands of New Zealand. The band had the amazing opportunity to meet Ms. Estes on a live google meet and she gave an overview of her process of composing a piece of music. Ms. Estes informed the band that the performance you will hear this evening is the New York Premiere of Cook Strait Crossing. 

He coached three student soloists along with the whole orchestra- Faith Borkowski (violin, on "*Recitative and Scherzo*" by Fritz Kreisler, Eujeong Choi (cello and orchestra, on "*Andante Cantabile*" by Piotr Tchaikovsky), and Sophia Barnes (bass, on "*Scherzo*" by Reinhold Glière).

All the student performers did an amazing job! Jordan brought everyone's playing to the next level with his insightful comments and joyful enthusiasm for performing. Thank you, Friends of Music, for making Jordan's visit possible with an enrichment grant!

#### From Jordan's website:

Jordan Bak is building an exciting international career as a trailblazing artist, praised for his radiant stage presence, dynamic interpretations, and fearless power. He is frequently in demand as a concerto soloist, recitalist, chamber musician and educator. Only the third violist to earn the Artist Diploma from The Juilliard School, Jordan Bak holds a Bachelor of Music degree with academic honors from New England Conservatory and a Master of Music degree from The Juilliard School, where he was awarded the prestigious Kovner Fellowship.





Congratulations to sophomore Eujeong Choi, who recently performed the solo part of the complete "Cello Concerto in E Minor" by Sir Edward Elgar with the Empire State Youth Orchestra. The performance took place at the Troy Savings Bank Music Hall and Eujeong did a fantastic job!

Sophomore Eujeong Choi, 15, is principal cellist of Niskayuna H.S. Symphony Orchestra as well as the Empire State Youth Symphony Orchestra. She studies under Dr. David Bebe. She has won a number of awards and accolades, including first place winner in the New York Laureate International Music Competition (2021), first place in the Prima Volta Music Competition (2021), and first place in the American Protégé International Music Talent Competition (2021). She was also a

finalist in the New York International Classical Music Competition (2021) and Uel Wade Scholarship Music competition (2021), where she won \$5000 in scholarship money.

#### **HS Concert and Stage Band**

Members of the Concert Band and the Stage Band, as well as Mr. Pandori's brass lesson students, had various opportunities to work with guest clinicians during the month of March as part of our Virtual Symposium for Music in Our Schools Month. The Stage Band was visited (virtually) by Greg Evans, Assistant Professor of Music Education, Jazz Studies, and Drum Set at Ithaca College. The students worked on "Cute" by Neal Hefti - a piece they later performed at the District Jazz Festival on April 6th. Trumpet students in the Concert Band worked in person with Dr. Peter Bellino - the director of ESYO Youth Jazz and a local trumpet pedagog. Brass Quintet students worked with Dr. Allyson Keyser - Professor of Trumpet at SUNY Schenectady - on two pieces of music they later performed at our first ever Chamber Concert on March 24th. Low Brass students in the Concert Band worked virtually with Dr. Christopher Hernacki - Professor of Trombone at the Crane School of Music - in a masterclass called "Becoming a Stylistic Chameleon". Finally, the entire Concert Band was visited (virtually) by guest composer Mr. Adrian Sims. Students performed his piece, "Energy!", for Mr. Sims and were given the opportunity to ask questions about careers in Music Education, Performance, and Composition.




