I teach K-5 general music and 4th and 5th grade choir at Rosendale Elementary.

One of my goals is to help students to find a connection to music so that they can continue to pursue it as life-long learners.

#### What are your favorite things to do outside of school?

I enjoy baking, hiking, kayaking, and spending time with my family.

#### Do you have any advice to students studying music now?

Keep going! Find the joy in your studies so that it is something you wish to continue.

#### Do you have any advice to students who want to pursue music as their career?

If you have the chance, learn how to play the piano along with the musical studies you are focusing on. Knowledge of music software and computer skills will help to make your involvement in music well rounded and allow for more opportunities in your career path.

### Seventh Grade General Music at Iroquois

Iroquois Middle School 7th graders have Mrs. Wilson and Mrs. Johnston for general music every other day for one semester. Those students assigned to Mrs. Johnston are breaking her in! While review units are completed in preparation for composition and well-loved keyboard time, Mrs. Johnston's students are taking breaks and watching a musical. Our musical is "*Into the Woods*" by Stephen Sondheim and directed by James Lapine. Theater vocabulary includes score vs. soundtrack and set design.

Seventh graders have made oversized music staffs for their table on poster board donated by art teacher Mr. Colby. Our new science teacher lent meter sticks and Mrs. Johnston purchased rolls of electrical tape. Five lines were measured out and covered with the black tape. ShopRite clear plastic cups placed in spaces or on lines allow students to have extra practice naming notes and to quiz each other.



Students in three 7th grade general music classes built a Rhythm Tree Pyramid showing division of the beat in 4/4 time. ShopRite has donated 1,200 Solo colored cups to show different note values. Six seventh grade classes will build pyramids this year as well as the Applied Music HS class. This was an attempt at offering a kinesthetic mode of learning as well as learning with Chromebooks and worksheets.
