Friends of Music interviews Catherine Jantson, General Music Teacher at Iroquois & VA Middle Schools, 7/8 Choir Teacher at Iroquois & Applied Music Teacher at Niskayuna High School



Where did you grow up?

I grew up in the Albany area - not too far from Niskayuna!

How were you involved in music growing up?

I was heavily involved in both music and the performing arts in general growing up! I played violin in orchestra and sang in choir. I performed in musicals, both at school and in community theater groups, from $6^{\rm th}$ through $12^{\rm th}$ grade. I participated in NYSSMA festivals for both voice and violin, and in high school I was selected to be in the Area All-State Mixed Choir and All-State Treble Choir.

Where did you go to college?

I graduated from Ithaca College with my Bachelor of Music in Music Education.

Do you have any favorite extracurricular activities that you want to share?

For one, I love to dance! I've trained in many styles almost my entire life and continue to take classes to this day. I also love photography! I love taking pictures of live events like concerts, dance performances, and theater productions.

What are your current responsibilities with Niskayuna?

I currently work in three buildings: Iroquois, Van Antwerp, and the High School. I teach general music at Iroquois and VA, and Applied Music at NHS. I also direct the 7th/8th Grade Choir at Iroquois.

What are your goals?

Even if music isn't a student's favorite subject, my hope is that they enjoy being in the room and walk away from class being exposed to something new. Whether it's listening to music from a composer they've never heard of, learning about and watching a musical for the first time in their life, or being able to play a simple song on the keyboard, my goal is for the students to leave with at least one new musical skill or some interesting music fun facts they can share with others!

What are your favorite things to do outside of school?

Outside of school, I love to spend time with family and friends (including my dog), find ways to stay active, and watch my favorite TV shows!

Do you have any advice to students studying music now?

When things get frustrating, keep persevering.

Do you have any advice to students who want to pursue music as their career?

Having a career in music requires you to be able to juggle a lot of things, so make sure you're able to manage your time well. Additionally, music requires you to be very collaborative and patient with others. Take as many opportunities as you can to work with others in a collaborative musical environment in order to work on those skills. Lastly, practicing your instrument never goes away, so take the time to figure out the best way to practice that works for you!

Nomination. In 2016, he composed original music for the
film Shortwave, which has since gone on to win multiple film
festival awards. Additional film credits include In the

<u>Heights</u>, and <u>Tick Tick Boom</u>. Dominic has appeared at almost any and every venue on the New York City scene, and has toured across the United States and abroad.

In addition to our three concerts, the Jazz Ensemble looks forward to our annual tour to the Middle Schools in December as well as our Holiday Assembly at the High School. We will also join the Middle School Jazz Band for a side-by-side rehearsal in December. Lots to look forward to this year!

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
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
