SPOTLIGHT NEWS

An Interview with Mrs. Teresa Broadwell, Former Niskayuna Music Teacher



Where did you grow up?

I grew up in a suburb of Rochester, NY. I graduated from Irondequoit High School.

How were you involved in music growing up? What inspired you? When did you know that you wanted to go to music school?

I sang in my school choruses and church choirs growing up. I started violin lessons in the 4^{th} grade. My inspiration came from my teachers and mentors, but mostly from my older brothers who played cello and violin/viola and got involved in bluegrass and rock music when I was still in my beginning stages of playing violin. Although I was a dedicated classical music student, I was highly motivated to play alternative styles of music as well - including bluegrass.

I was encouraged by all my music teachers to pursue music as a career. I attended Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam where I received my BM in Music Ed.

Tell us about the early days and some memorable moments of the Niskayuna's music program.

My tenure in Niskayuna started in 2000. I was surprised by how small the string program was, so I tried to inspire my students by exposing them to the very best classic orchestra repertoire, but I also wanted them to have an opportunity to play alternative styles as well, so I started *Fiddle Club* at Rosendale, Birchwood and Iroquois. This proved to be a very good idea for recruitment and retention of students, but mostly, the kids really loved playing together in a more casual setting. It broadened their understanding of why we learn to play instruments in the first place! Memorable moments include playing at Music festivals in the area, including the annual *Dance Flurry* festival in Saratoga for several years. Our 8th grade orchestra received a Gold at NYSSMA one year. We also participated in many adjudicated music festivals in Massachusetts over a number of years and always got gold awards. After competing, students got to spend the rest of the day at the Six Flags Park there.

What are your experiences in the music world outside of Niskayuna?

I've been a professional performer my entire adult life. I've always had a band - *Old Time Music* in college, then I transitioned to swing and jazz music after college. I've continued to play out at clubs and events while I was teaching in Niskayuna, and presently play in public many times each month.

Do you have other favorite activities other than music?

I enjoy travel, bike riding and spending time with my grandchildren.

Do you have any advice for students studying music now?

Yes - practice daily. Find music you love, and it will be a joy.

Do you have any advice to students who want to pursue music as their career?

Yes - practice daily and explore all the different areas in the music world where you think your interests and talent would be best put to use. Also, pursue what you enjoy most, and you will find you niche!

Choral Corner



How can it possibly be the end of the 2024-2025 school year?! This one has been quick, fun, intense, and full of growth. The final examination in the large ensemble classes is KARAOKE! Some students have elected to perform live solos, duets and trios for their classmates, others are providing a prerecorded video to share with their peers (often including choreography or costuming), and some are submitting a video recording for only Mrs. Catalano to view as per their comfort level. Students are allowed to sing any song that is school appropriate, including songs in other languages in addition to opportunities to accompany oneself on an instrument instead of using a backtrack. We setup the TV in the classroom to project the lyrics along with microphones and speakers to create a supportive and meaningful (and very fun) experience.

CHORAL UNIFORMS

- Students in *Bel Canto Voices and Studio Singers* will receive their paperwork for uniforms <u>in the fall</u>, upon returning to school.
- ALL USED BEL CANTO VOICES and STUDIO SINGERS' UNIFORMS THAT WILL BE SUBMITTED FOR RESALE MUST BE <u>DRY-CLEANED</u> AND TURNED IN BY <u>FRIDAY</u>, <u>JUNE 20</u>. Students can bring uniforms to the choir room before classes end (or when they are in for testing), or you can drop uniforms at the front entrance of the HS. Any uniform that is stained, damaged or in poor condition will not be accepted for resale and will be discarded. Any uniform turned in for resale that does not have the correct paperwork attached in order to contact the seller will be donated to the Friends of Music. <u>Paperwork will be shared on Parent Square and will be handed out during class in early June</u>.

*With the change in the Niskayuna HS Concert Attire policy (concert black), students with old Ladies First and Concert Chorale uniforms can donate them having been dry-cleaned and in good condition.

Concert Band News



The High School Concert Band welcomed MANY guests with the help of the Friends of Music and other donors this Spring! Some of the highlights:

In February, Guest Composer Aakash Mittal visited our campus to work with the Concert Band students on his piece *Salt March* - a piece which explores the concept of the historical march as a nonviolent protest. Aakash spent the day at Niskayuna High School as part of a cross departmental collaboration with the Social Studies department. He with choir and band students in a participatory workshop of Konnakol and Raga, exploring and performing traditional Indian rhythmic singing, presented a session with all Global 10 students on the Salt March movement from a historical standpoint. The visit was made possible by generous funds from the Niskayuna Friends of Music, the High School PTO, the Social Studies Department, Mr. Rickert and the Tri City India Association including a

generous donation from the Muralimanohar family.







In March, we were visited by Guest Conductor, David Blumenthal - Band Director at LaGuardia High School of Music, Art, and Performing Arts in New York City - his visit culminated with our District Band Festival at Proctors - made possible by the Friends of Music.





Later on in March, we were visited by a trombone duo from New York City. Haim Avitsur (Hartt School of Music) and Andrea Neumann (internationally known freelance trombonist). The group performed and worked with students from Niskayuna in addition to SUNY Schenectady, Shenendehowa, and Burnt Hills. This visit was made possible by enrichment grants from the Niskayuna Friends of Music as well as by the other schools involved. Nisky trombonists Caitlin Li, Daniel Korevaar, and Noah Martinez all participated in the masterclass.









And finally in April, we had the opportunity to work with Michael Cordaro, Director of Bands at the award-winning William Floyd High School on Long Island. 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
