

HS Concert Band

The High School Concert Band is the largest band we have seen in recent years and the students have been working diligently since the beginning of September! On November 6th the band will be performing an exciting and diverse program of new pieces - March of The Shadows by Haley Woodrow, Tribal Journeys by Justin Harden - and an old favorite, The Witch and the Saint arranged by Carl Reinecke. We are looking forward to collaborating with the Symphonic Band in February as a mini-High School Band Festival with the theme "Forged in Courage" - look for an exciting combined thematic program with the two High School Bands on February 5! In addition to our final concert on May, 28th, the Concert Band will also perform at the annual Memorial Day Assembly on May 12th - we look forward to this chance to honor our veterans every year.

We would like to thank the Friends of Music for sponsoring our part in a BRAND NEW PIECE written for Concert Band by Aakash Mittal. The band performed "Salt March" by Mittal at last year's District Band Festival - we also welcomed the composer into school last February (thanks to funds from FOM, the HS PTO, NHS Social Studies Department, the Murlalimanohar family, and Bristol Hills Music Camp) to work with all of our 10th grade students in addition to Band and Choir students in the High School. We are thrilled now to be a part of the consortium funding his new piece, "Awaz" which will be delivered in June of next year. We look forward to working on and performing this piece in the 2026-2027 school year. Thanks, FOM!

"Awaz is a Hindi-Urdu word that translates to mean "noise, sound, and voice" depending on the context. Awaz for Wind Ensemble will explore these three meanings as three movements of music. This piece will incorporate elements of structured musical improvisation. Rather than employing Jazz chord changes, the score will give students specific scales and simple musical "games" that will add color and spontaneity to the piece. The score will come with instructions and a guide for both students and teachers to explore the improvisation elements as an ensemble. I will be drawing from twenty one years of teaching beginning improvisers to create improvisation structures that are accessible to musicians who don't have Jazz training. Awaz for Wind Ensemble will also feature a soprano vocalist providing the opportunity to showcase a vocal student or bring in a special guest." - Mittal

Austin Day - District Jazz Festival Guest Artist



Austin Day, teaches Band, Music Technology, and directs the Jazz ensembles at Sleepy Hollow Middle/High School in Sleepy Hollow, NY. He holds a Bachelor of Music in Music Education with a minor in Jazz Studies from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam and a Master of Music in Jazz Studies from the University of Northern Colorado.

Mr. Day has been teaching in public school since 2014. He has been invited as a guest artist/clinician at music festivals throughout New York State. He has conducted Student Honor Ensembles in Westchester, Putnam, and Dutchess counties as well as the Capitol region, Syracuse, and the Adirondacks. Mr. Day was awarded the 2024 Music Education Innovation Award by the New York State School Music Association. In addition to his work as an educator, Mr. Day works as a professional Saxophonist in the New York Tri-State region. He has contributed to dozens of recordings for prominent Jazz, Rock, Pop, and R&B artists, was a member of multiple Downbeat Award-winning jazz ensembles, and has performed throughout the United States, Mexico, Canada, and Europe.

Mr. Day has been invited to speak as a guest lecturer in Jazz History and as a guest clinician in colleges and universities throughout the country. He has also presented presentations on Cultivating Creativity in the Electronic Music Classroom at state and national music education conferences. In addition, Mr. Day has also presented several lectures on the Music Industry for the pre-college program at NYU Steinhardt. 


